
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FISMA Overview at NSF

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- \$ 6.2B in Research and Education Grants in 2011
- Over 61,000 requests for funding via electronic submission intellectual property (2012)
- FISMA review is contracted to CPA firm
- 2011 FISMA OIG Cyberscope and Narrative Report
- FISMA coverage: 8 agency systems (3 contractor)





Improved security posture across government

Continued focus on information security by senior officials

×Improvements from audit recommendations

- Network architecture is not addressed in the questions
- Point in time status, not continuous monitoring
 - Response to issues during year is not reported
- Some Y / N questions instead of narrative answers

FISMA 2012

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- Automated and continuous monitoring
- Reporting of security incidents
- Compliance with NIST Standards
- Director of OMB oversight authority
- No additional funding



- Supplement OMB questionnaire with a narrative report
- Ensure FISMA and Financial Statement auditors communicate results to each other



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
