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

Risk Management Framework (RMF) Steps, SP 800-37, rev 1

- 1: Categorize Information System
- 2: Select Security Controls
- **3: Implement Security Controls**
- 4: Assess Security Controls
- 5: Authorize Information System

6: Monitor Security Controls

 - 33 tools and 25 vendors




High Noon is Coming

- Implemented February 2011


Big impact



- Reporting status frequently






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
