

- 76 associate degree options and 41 certificate programs



# Look inside the curriculum

- Started out ambitiously- developed 8 classes
  - Introduction
  - Security Administration
  - Firewalls
  - OS Security
  - Disaster Recovery
  - Web Security
  - Network Security Fundamentals
  - Network Defense and Countermeasures
- User Support, Help Desk Curriculum
  - requires 2 Security courses, up to 4 possible
- 2 year long certificates managerial and technical
- All CIS program allow Security electives




# Three years ago and now
