Interdependence of the Global Marketplace

Anti-spam measures need to be balanced by the following considerations:

- Legitimate business interests should not be unnecessarily impeded.
- Nations are striving to be the #1 Digital Economy.
- International data flows are immense and critical.

No "Silver Bullet"!

How Can We Combat Spam?

- Gather and Analyze Data to Determine Actual Roots of Problem
- Seek Global Solutions for Global Impact
- Diversify Anti-spam Approaches:
 - Regulatory Solutions Coupled with Education and Technology Solutions
 - Involvement of All Stakeholders
- Avoid Unintended Consequences Such as Interruption of Legitimate Business Activities

The Role of Legislation & Regulation – U.S.

- U.S. CAN-SPAM Act of 2003:
 - ◆ Opt-Out Approach Striking a Balance
 - ◆ Prohibit Use of Deceptive Subject Lines and False Headers, Harvesting and Dictionary Attacks
 - ◆ FTC Is Authorized to Investigate the Feasibility of a "Do-not-email" Registry
- **■** Federal V. State Legislation
- Confronting Harmful spam
- **■** Technical Solutions

International/Multilateral Efforts

- Opt-in approaches EU Directive
- Opt-out approaches Mexico, Japan, etc.
- National enforcement efforts
- Agreement on importance of technical solutions, consumer/business awareness, focus on harmful spam
- Multilateral Fronts:
 - OECD
 - APEC

Private Sector Solutions & Education

- Governments Must Demonstrate Flexibility/
 Support Private Sector Initiatives
- Research & Development
- Industry Coalitions
- Technical Solutions and Trust Programs
- Anti-spam Education & Outreach

Cross-Border Cooperation & Enforcement

- International Problem:
 - ◆ Cross-Border Cooperation is Critical
 - ◆ Information Exchange and Collaboration Imperative
 - ◆ Focus on Anti-spam Initiatives and Enforcement is Essential
